School News:

Black History Month

Our focus this year is on STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art & Mathematics) looking at leading Black scientists, inventors, artists and mathematicians. This year's Remembrance Day assembly will also focus on the contribution of African & Caribbean soldiers in both World Wars.

Sports News:

Our first inter-school sports fixtures will be starting again on 6th October with a year 6 boys football match against Highfields and Prince of Wales Schools at PowerLeague, and a crosscountry event for boys and girls from years 5 & 6. Good luck to everyone taking part!

<u>Online Safety:</u>

All our children have been learning how to keep themselves safe on the internet. Years 1-6 have watched and discussed videos produced by CEOP (Child Exploitation & Online Protection) and know what to do if they need to report a problem. Children in Reception have heard the story of Smartie the Penguin and his online adventures.

<u>Assemblies:</u>

Although we have not returned to whole-school assemblies yet, we are sharing a collective act of worship every week in phases: either two year groups attend a 'live' assembly with Mrs Johnstone, two have hymn practice with Miss O'Halloran; or we watch a 'virtual liturgy' produced by the Mark 10 Mission.

<u>RE:</u>

The RE unit this half term is "Beginning with God". We are learning about the nature of God and how He reveals Himself to us.
