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Comic Relief/Red Nose Day!

As we all know Red Nose Day is very special. It is an annual fundraising campaign with a mission to end child poverty by funding programs to keep children safe, educated and healthy. In 1985, as a response to an extreme short supply in food in the country Ethiopia and other countries struck by poverty, British comedian Lenny Henry and British comedy script writer Richard Curtis co-founded and co-created the British charity, Comic Relief. They then started Red Nose Day.

On 8th February 1988, Lenny Henry went to Ethiopia and created the very first Red Nose Day Telethon. Over 150 celebrities and comedians participated. The huge event raised over

£15 million and attracted a whopping 30 million television viewers to BBC One! Keep in mind this was only the first year. Yeah I know right! In 2011, it raised a record breaking 108.4 million pounds. There are a lot of interesting facts about Red Nose Day; For example, did you know the first Red Nose Day broadcast took place on Christmas Day! Or that every pound donated has so far helped more than 750,000

people in the UK experiencing financial and material poverty to access advice and support? Did you also know that the money you have donated has helped more than 29,000 people who have experienced or at risk the domestic abuse to access safe accommodation. Regardless, please please on Red Nose Day give a pound to either your teacher or the office. The money goes to Comic Relief. £1 can do wonders. Thank you for reading.

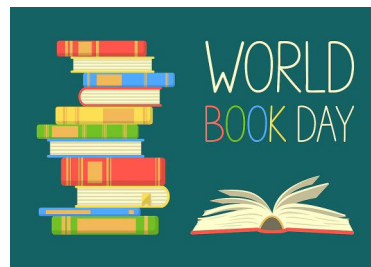

Science Week 2022

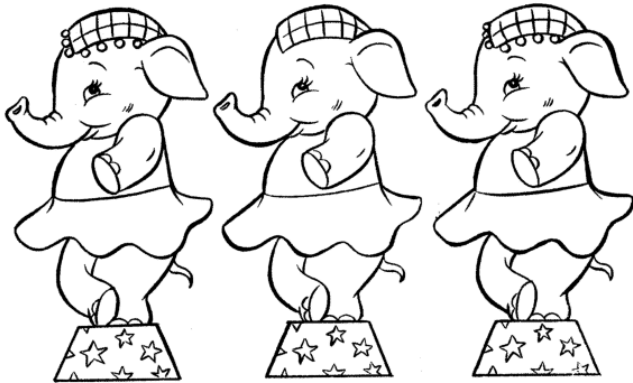

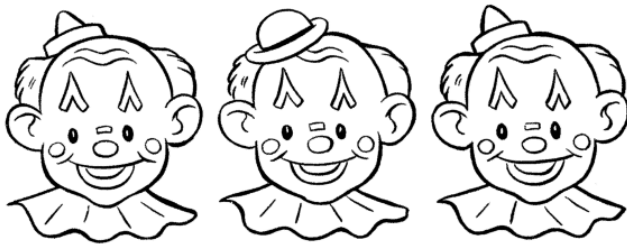
able to make it an even bigger celebration. Make sure to tell people at home about the cool things you did!



Puzzle Zone!

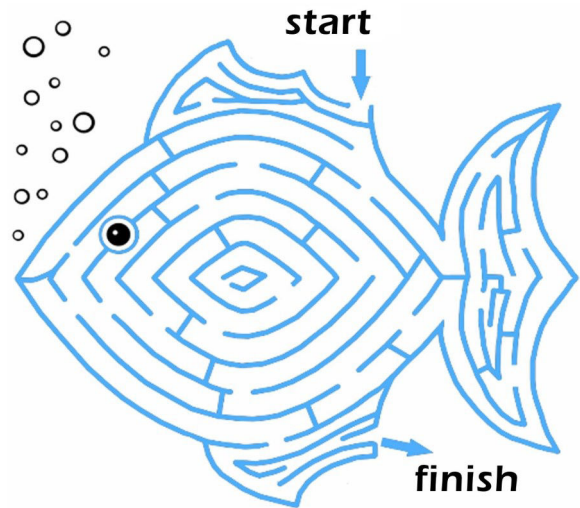
