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Cadbury Exposed

Chocolate. Loved by many of us. When you think of chocolate don't you think of Cadbury? Cadbury is like the face of chocolate. The 2 billion pound company has a secret that was recently discovered which it doesn't want you to know about. Who is the reason for their delicious treats? What is their fair trade like? Those questions will be answered in this article.

You probably didn't know that illegal child labour in Ghana is being used to supply cocoa beans for Britain's favourite chocolate. Young children, who deserve an education and as young as 10 years old are working grueling hours on farms supplying Cadbury. Carrying heavy loads like a body builder and most of them don't know where the chocolate goes. Plus they don't get paid enough! When I say they don't get paid enough, I mean they don't get paid ENOUGH! They make 11% of the final value of a bar of chocolate and that's just the adult farm-

ers. Imagine how much the children make or do they even make anything? The farmer's say that the low pay for their beans means they can afford barely a single adult laborer. Remember this is a lower currency, so it is probably not even up to a British Pound. They use machetes and incredibly sharp knives to slice the cocoa beans, which sadly lead them to getting cut.

And they work the next day. Some even get bitten by snakes while working on the farm.

Channel 4 even interviewed a girl and she claimed to being

kept against her will. Cadbury claim to support ethical cocoa farming through its cocoa life brand.

A child age 11 told Channel 4 that she was told she would be helping with a baby but instead she had to farm. (bottom). She eventually cut her leg. Cadbury's owners Mondelez refused to respond to the abuse these poor children are going through.

They promised to stop this over 20 years ago and they haven't. Mondelez made over \$4 billion in profit last year. So the money

is there to pay the farmers. What a greedy load of people!

It's celebrated across the UK and gives students, parents and teachers a chance to just say THANKS!

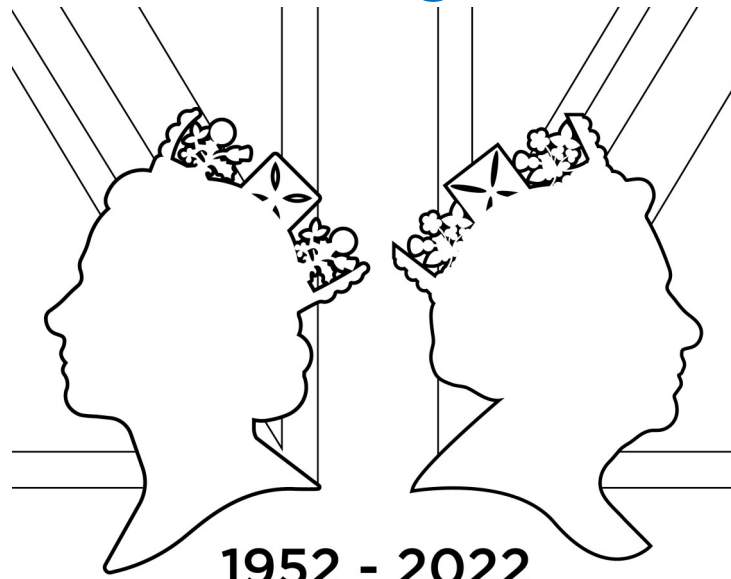
