Pupil Premium Strategy 2019/20

Review: Summer 2020

IMPACT of funding for Pupil Premium, as outlined in the strategy below: 2019/2020

(Based on tracking report, end of Spring Term 2020, looking at disadvantaged pupils)

The school tracks the progress of each pupil throughout the year in order to quickly identify successes, areas for development and develop strategies or 'next steps' to promote improvement.

Due to COVID-19 there was a national lockdown which involved school closure from 23rd March 2020. All national tests were cancelled.

In the absence of any national test results, KS1 and 2 SATs, Phonics and Early Learning Goals, the following data is taken from our Spring term 2020 Tracking Report. We are confident that we are closing the gap with National non-PP pupils.

Our response:

Maths continued as our main focus for development for the past year and continues to be so.

- Last Summer 2019, Year 5 low mid, pupil premium pupils received support for 5 weeks in number and place value
- Last Autumn 2019, Year 6 More Able pupil premium pupils (20) received targeted support for 5 weeks, aiming for greater depth.
- Spring 2020, Year 6 pupils (20) who were identified by class teachers as low mid, pupil premium pupils with the hope of securing a solid expected grade.
- As part of our embedding of Inspire Maths, support is being given to our Maths leader and teachers with planning lessons to develop quality first teaching.

Reading was also a particular focus and we used Pupil Premium funding to provide teaching to smaller groups of pupils and interventions and support in KS1 eg writing support to targeted groups in Years R and 1 and Speech interventions in Year R.

We believe in, and are committed to, a broad curriculum which offers our pupils experiences in the arts, sport and music which they may not otherwise have. Pupils throughout the school benefit from after-school clubs which develop skills involving instrumental music, art, sewing, cooking and dance. This supports their all-round development and offers them opportunities to develop language skills while working in a small group with an adult. Every Pupil Premium child is offered these enrichment activities. These activities and opportunities took place in the summer and autumn terms of 2019 and in the Spring term of 2020 prior to school closure during national lockdown.

As we move into the academic year 2020/21 we will continue to make provision which supports those pupils who are financially needy in order to narrow the gap with those less so. We endeavour to support and improve the needs, learning and development of all our pupils, conscious of the possible impact on pupils' emotional wellbeing and learning as a result of the lengthy school closure due to COVID-19.
