School News:

Quality Mark Accreditation-We are delighted that we have recently been re-awarded the Quality Mark Accreditation. This award celebrates the progress and improvements made by a school in English and mathematics. It highlights some of the fantastic work that forms the 'bedrock' of a good education in St Edmund's.

Millfield Theatre-Children from Years 4, 5 and 6 attended a very special theatre production at Millfield Theatre. The production was an exciting opportunity for children to see a live performance from the 'Dream Believe, Succeed' project, which is funded by the Mayor's Young Londoners Fund.

Music-Children in reception were given a special concert of both classical and traditional Irish music from Mrs Connolly on the flute and her son Ben on the harp and violin.



Year 3 has started **recorder lessons** this half term; they have learnt how to play Hot Cross Buns in just time for Easter! One of the children said, "I've never played the recorder before but I'm enjoying these music lessons and I'm getting better."

Starfish Workshops-Some children in Years 4, 5 and 6 have taken part in 'Starfish' workshops run by Every Parent & Child (<u>https://epandc.org.uk/</u>) and the Edmonton Community Partnership (https://edmontoncommunitypartnership.org/) Year 4 have been writing and performing poetry. Years 5 and 6 have had some sessions about building confidence and finding their voice. Year 5 have also been involved with developing our young leaders and they have been planning and organising a project to create prayer spaces around the school.



STEAM Day this year was on the theme of the UN Global Goal 15: Life on Land. Children focussed on the rainforests and de-forestation and learnt about conservation and what *they* could do to protect our wonderful planet.

French-During French week the children looked at French culture: they found out about some French landmarks, they created art works in the style of French artists and they learnt some French songs. Continuez à faire du bon travail mes enfants!

Leaders-'Red Ties' have been selected for the spring term. Children are selected because of their exemplary behaviour: they are role models for the rest of the school and they have high expectations of themselves and of everybody else. researching the Year of the Tiger for information leaflets, and practising our Tai Chi.
